Daedalus intends to maintain the highest level of intellectual and scholastic standards in its publications. At the same time, we intend to establish the Institute as a very credible and trusted source for the objective examination of issues. Publication with the Institute's imprimatur should convey a strong sense of legitimacy, quality, trustworthiness, and scholastic excellence.

All submissions will be reviewed for appropriateness by the Institutes editorial review board and will be accepted, conditionally accepted, or rejected with recommendations. The criteria for acceptance are provided in the attached presentation.
